Inspection of the Imastu School-Home of AS Hoolekandeteenused

On 19 May 2014 advisors to the Chancellor of Justice inspected the provision of 24-hour special care services to minors on the basis of a court ruling in the Imastu School-Home of AS Hoolekandeteenused.

Six minors were receiving the 24-hour special care service on the basis of a court ruling at the time of the inspection.

The Chancellor of Justice has not inspected the provision of 24-hour special care services in the Imastu Home before.

As a result of the inspection visit the Chancellor of Justice makes the following suggestions to Imastu Home to guarantee the fundamental rights and freedoms of persons:

- to guarantee that the minors receiving the service on the basis of a court ruling have the opportunity to stay safely in open air and to engage in suitable leisure activities whilst in open air;
- to find ways of organising work in the department of minors referred to special care
 with a court ruling in such a manner that the prohibition of being outside applied to
 influence the behaviour of one persons does not have to be tolerated by the other minors
 receiving the service as well;
- to avoid using the prohibition on going outside as a measure to influence behaviour.
